DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY – LINGUISTICS – 2022-23

In addition to departmental requirements, candidates for graduate degrees must fulfill University requirements as described in the "Graduate Education" section of the UCSB General Catalog.

The Ph.D. requires a minimum of **36.0 units** of graduate-level coursework beyond those required for the M.A. Each course may fulfill only one Linguistics degree requirement. Students must take all required courses for a letter grade if that option is available. All courses must be passed with a grade of B+ or better, with the exception of those that do not have letter-grade options, which must be passed satisfactorily. Students are required to maintain a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.3. Additionally, students are expected to enroll in LING 272: Colloquium each quarter. Students are strongly encouraged to take coursework beyond the required minimum selected in consultation with their faculty advisor.

Time-to-Degree: Student may take up to 4 years to advance to candidacy and 7 years to complete the Ph.D. without penalty. However, the program is designed so that students can advance to candidacy in 2 to 3 years and complete the Ph.D. in 4 to 5 years.

DOCTORAL COMMITTEE

Students must establish a four-member doctoral committee to guide their progress through the program. At least three of these members must be UC Academic Senate faculty. At least two of the four members must be from within the Department of Linguistics, and at least one member must be from outside the Department of Linguistics. The membership of the student's advisory committee may evolve as the student progresses through the various stages of the doctoral program, with successive committees established for the qualifying project, Ph.D. qualifying examination, and Ph.D. dissertation. The structure of these committees, and their specific roles, are as specified in the Linguistics Graduate Handbook.

QUALIFYING PROJECT REQUIREMENT

The student must propose and carry out a substantial project informed by research, the "qualifying project". The scope, content, and nature of the project must be determined in consultation with and with the approval of the student's committee, as described in the Linguistics Graduate Handbook. This requirement must be completed, including submission to a publication outlet or other form of public dissemination, before the qualifying examination is taken.

QUALIFYING EXAMINATION

- C. Comprehensive face-to-face exam based on a bibliography of 30-40 readings from at least 8 different courses (each quarter of a multi-quarter sequence [e.g., 221ABC] counts as one course).
