**MASTER OF ARTS – COMPARATIVE LITERATURE, FRENCH SPECIALIZATION – 2022-23 (Plan I)**

*In addition to departmental requirements, candidates for graduate degrees must fulfill University requirements described in the “Graduate Education” section of the UCSB General Catalog.*

*A total of 64.0 units are required for the M.A./Ph.D. program – 40.0 units in the M.A. portion of the program and 24.0 units in the Ph.D. portion.\* Students in the M.A./Ph.D. program must first complete the requirements for the M.A. before continuing toward the doctorate. A minimum of 40.0 units of graduate-level course work, including one 4-unit proseminar and course work in three fields are required for the M.A. program. Students will devote both fields 1 and 3 to French and Francophone studies, with Field 3 focusing on Francophone culture and literature in a broad interdisciplinary sense. Field 2 is devoted to the study of a second national literature and will have a focus that complements that of the first field. A maximum of 4 units of 596, Directed Reading and Research, can be counted towards the master’s degree. All core courses must be completed with a ‘B’ or better. All students need to maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 to be in good academic standing.*

*\*All graduate students must enroll in and complete 12 units per quarter regardless of whether or not they have met the minimum unit requirement. Students must enroll in at least two graduate level courses per quarter for letter grade until advanced to candidacy, except during their field exam quarters or during the quarter in which they are writing their dissertation prospectus, at which time they may enroll in graduate level courses and/or independent studies on a P/NP [S/U]basis.*

**CAPSTONE REQUIREMENT: MASTER'S THESIS**

By the end of the second year of study, students must successfully complete a 50-page essay, including works cited section and footnotes, in French and Francophone literature and culture. Non-native speakers of English must write their essay in English. The essay and its oral defense are based upon an abstract and a reading list of about 50 works, both primary and secondary, that students develop with their three-member exam committee. The expectation is for primary literature to be read in its original language. Following the successful completion of the essay, students must also pass an oral examination defending their thesis and answering questions on their larger reading list. Students must pass both the written and oral to pass the examination. The following grading system will be used: High Pass/ Pass/ Pass with revisions/ No Pass. The thesis and its oral defense can only be retaken once.
