MASTER OF ARTS – LATIN AMERICAN AND IBERIAN STUDIES – 2022-23 (Plan I)

In addition to departmental requirements, candidates for graduate degrees must fulfill University requirements described in the “Graduate Education” section of the UCSB General Catalog.

*A total of **40.0 units** are required for the M.A. program. Students take at least 32 units of upper-division and graduate coursework in Latin American and Iberian Studies and 6 additional units of Master’s Thesis Research and Preparation (598). Up to 12 coursework units can be at the upper-division undergraduate level. These undergraduate courses must be from the list of approved LAIS courses, and students must have the approval of the instructor, who may assign additional work. A maximum of 8 units of 596, Directed Reading and Research, can be counted towards the master’s degree. All courses must be passed with a grade of B or better. Graduate students must enroll in and complete 12 units per quarter. The time-to-degree is two years.*
