<b>THESIS REQUIREMENT</b>	
<p>All students are expected to write and defend an original M.A. thesis. After nomination of the M.A. committee and successful submission of the thesis, the student undergoes a thesis defense. All required degree coursework must be completed by the end of the quarter in which the thesis is submitted. The student's master's committee supervises the thesis research, administers the thesis defense, and certifies the completion of required coursework. The student's entire MA committee must attend the thesis defense in person. If a committee member must be away from the area or is unable to participate due to extenuating circumstances, they may participate via Zoom, Skype, or other live video conferencing method.</p>
