## MASTER OF ARTS - PSYCHOLOGICAL & BRAIN SCIENCES - 2022-23 (Plan I)

In addition to departmental requirements, candidates for graduate degrees must fulfill University requirements described in the "Graduate Education" section of the UCSB General Catalog.

The Department of Psychological & Brain Sciences does not offer a terminal M.A. program. Admission is to the Ph.D. program only. Master's degrees may be awarded in the case of students who leave the Ph.D. program, or for continuing students who, along with completing a minimum of **30.0** units, have successfully completed the requirements of the first two years of the Ph.D. program, completed an acceptable master's thesis, and request the M.A. degree.

The requirements for the M.A. in Psychological & Brain Sciences are:

A. Master's level performance in two statistics courses (PSY 221A-B) in Year 1 with a B average grade and one additional statistics course from an approved list (<a href="http://tinyurl.com/k7d2qhp">http://tinyurl.com/k7d2qhp</a>) in Year 1 or 2, with a B or S grade.

B. Master's level performance in five additional courses for a minimum of 18 units. Three of these must be taken during Year 1 and must be 200-level PSY courses, taken for a letter grade with a B average grade (only two 200-level PSY courses are needed in the first year if the 'additional statistics course' from Part A is also a 200-level PSY course, taken for a grade). Courses in the second year may be 200- or 594-level graduate courses or, with permission of the student's advisor, upper-division undergraduate courses; can be taken outside the department; and can be taken P/NP or S/NS.
